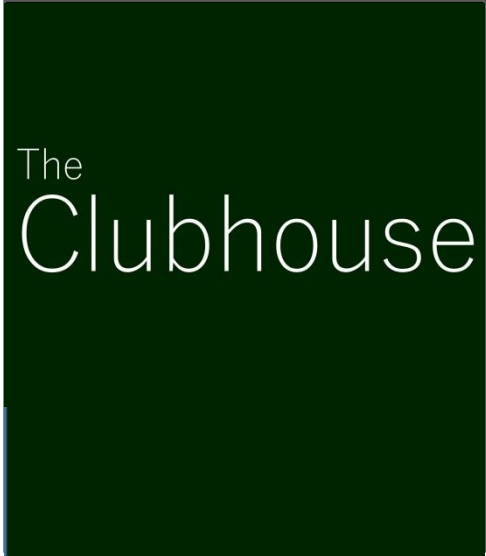

Welcome to West Bradford Golf Club

West Bradford Golf Club is a private members golf club set around a historic 300 year old Grade II listed Clubhouse, situated in Heaton Village, some three miles North West of Bradford city centre. It is 14 miles from Leeds and 21 miles from Harrogate.

The golf club itself was established in 1900 as a private members club for wealthy wool and textile barons in the city, part of the growing UK textile industry.

West Bradford is a course that boasts real golfing pedigree, having been originally constructed and then redesigned, by some of the most well known names in golf.



Today West Bradford Golf Club is renowned for its friendliness, and lives by the principals laid down by Walter Hodgson, Club Secretary in 1950: *“West Bradford aims at the fundamentals required for the success of any golf club; a good course, a good house, a good table, good conduct and - above all – good fellowship.”*





About The Course

A classic parkland course...

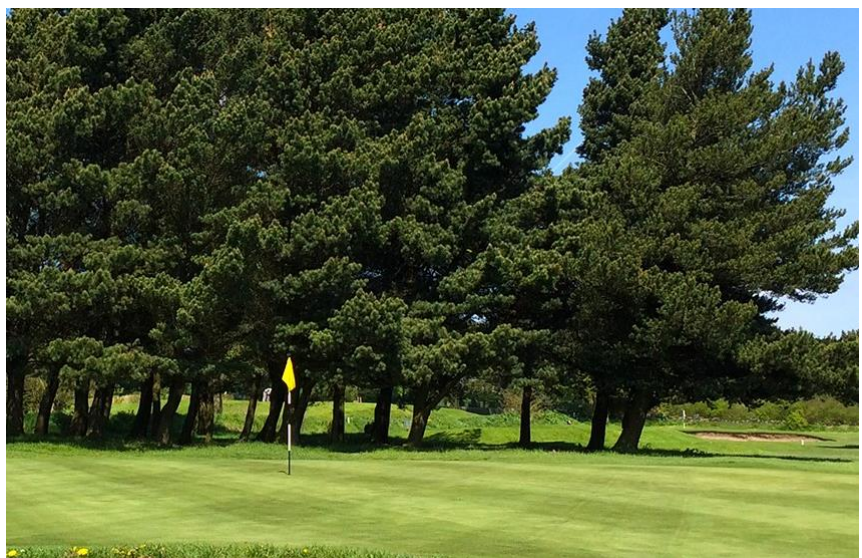
West Bradford is a classic mature parkland course, and one with real golfing pedigree. The 18-hole course was originally constructed in 1900 by James Carter & Co, London – who developed the Old Course at Sunningdale Golf Club a few years earlier.



In the 1940's West Bradford Golf Club commissioned Hawtree + Son - the renowned family firm of course architects behind the redesign of Royal Birkdale and Royal Aberdeen - to redesign the golf course at West Bradford.

The father & son team of F.G. and F.W. Hawtree made significant alterations throughout the whole course, and introduced two new holes – the current holes 4 and 5. The overall course layout designed by Hawtree + Son remains in place today.





About The Course

“A grand old course full of character”...

“A grand old course full of character” wrote a recent reviewer of the golf course. The course at West Bradford is 118 years old and is undoubtedly one of the finest and most characterful parkland golf courses in the region.

It was designed to offer variety to the golfer, and it doesn't disappoint. Variety playing West Bradford comes both in length of hole – long par 5's and short par 3's are evenly spread throughout your round, and in the type of golfing challenge offered – which varies dramatically from hole to hole, and from one green to the next.

The course at West Bradford will challenge long hitters and short hitters alike. In particular approach shots to the often sloping, always beautifully contoured greens, must be well planned. That being said the course as a whole, despite some narrow fairways, is not particularly punitive for the high handicapper, and can be enjoyed by golfers of all abilities.





About The Clubhouse

A clubhouse steeped in history...

The clubhouse at West Bradford is steeped in history, it was originally a Georgian era manor house built by The Bolling family of Bradford in 1720, it stands today as a Grade II listed building. The initials EB (Edward Bolling) and the date 1720 can be seen carved in stone above the entrance doorway.

The Main Bar & Restaurant

The main bar and restaurant at West Bradford Golf Club is a large open plan room. The front part of the room, housing the bar, is part of the original Manor House structure, dating back to 1720. The rear of the room, with its distinctive vaulted ceiling, is an extension to the original building. Doors lead out to a picturesque patio seating area overlooking the 1st tee and fairway and 18th fairway and green.



The 19th Hole

A door on the right hand side of the bar will lead you in to The 19th Hole, which is a small, self contained, private snug, with its own bar access. The 19th Hole can comfortably seat 18-20 people. The door to The 19th Hole has a beautiful stained glass window set into it. The 19th is perfect for small private gatherings or for enjoying drinks or bar snacks away from the main room. It can be reserved for use by visiting Societies or Corporate groups.
