Happy Friday Everyone,

The Foremost click and collect is working well, with a few more members taking advantage of this great service. There really is a lot of choice on the site so why not take a look.

Onto the new segment, golfing tip of the week.

Hole 2 – From the white tees the tight out of bounds on the right forces many tee shots left and into trouble. Opting to take less club for accuracy will still leave a medium to short iron into the green. The approach shot is arguably the toughest on the course and requires your full concentration. In firmer conditions, consider landing the ball short of the green as it is almost impossible to hold, even with a short iron.
